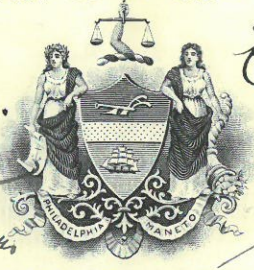

Dear Sir:-

In the early part of the year I was honored with a program and invitation to be present at the opening of the Linden Museum in Stuttgart.

Under separate cover, I am enclosing a brief history of The Philadelphia Museums, a late annual report or two and publications from the educational department and also some from our department for foreign commerce.

Our work is divided into three departments:-

1st. A department of exhibits in which we are attempting to make individual displays of different countries sufficient to show up the products and something of the habits and customs of each, both geographic and ethnographic.

2nd. A department of education in which, by means of appropriations from both the State and City, we are attempting to aid the schools throughout the State of Pennsylvania.

3rd. A department of Commerce in which we are aiding our manufacturers and buyers in the United States to come in touch with the manufacturers and commercial houses of foreign countries.

I am sending you several publications relative to each of these departments. We have not yet published any general catalogs. When we do I shall be glad to send them.

I desire to solicit from you any and all of your publications, catalogs, and photographs of your buildings and departments. I wish very much to come in close touch with your institution in order that we may exchange publications and later, possibly, material.

I anticipate with pleasure your coming communications.
